The Learning Pit


At our school we use the metaphor of the Learning Pit to help our students face new challenges, build resilience and persevere when things get tough. We know that achievement is preceded by having a goal and striving for it.

When learning is hard, sometimes students get frustrated, become anxious and unwilling to fail. This can lead them to giving up, asking an adult to do it for them, or merely copying others.

We talk about the Learning Pit at school - being in the

learning pit is tough! New learning can feel overwhelming and difficult. However, we can use Growth Mindset language to help us move through the learning Pit, step by step. Having a red-hot go, locking into learning, making mistakes, showing grit, are all great examples of self-talk that can help lead students through the pit and out the other side, towards achievement.
