



PE Newsletter Term 3 2022

This Term in Physical Education, our students are learning a range of skills and concepts. Each unit is focusing on different topics for the first half of term before moving into Dance, Rhythm and Movement for the second half.

Foundation & Grade 1/2 Physical Education

Our Foundation and Junior students have been learning how to run, dodge and evade. Students have been learning the key components of the fundamental movement skills of the run and dodge and have analysed video to embed this knowledge.

They have been playing lots of running, dodging and evading games. Some of the most popular games have been "Rat's and Rabbits" and "Giants, Wizards and Elves."

Grade 3/4 Physical Education

Our Middle students have been learning about games and sports from other cultures. Our focus to start the term has been on Australian Indigenous games and sports. Students have enjoyed playing the modified games and adapting their skills to suit the new games. Students have also discussed why some of these games were played by indigenous people and why the skills those games practised would be important. E.g. throwing accuracy and speed for hunting.

Over the coming weeks we will continue to explore indigenous games and also explore games and sports from other parts of the world including Europe and Asia. Students are very excited to learn some Japanese games and sports that they have been introduced to through our Japanese Day and Japanese lessons.

Grade 5/6 Physical Education

Our Senior students have been learning about how community sport works as part of SEPEP (Sport Education in Physical Education Program). Each senior class is running their own basketball competition with three teams. Each week there are three matches with students playing two and being the duty team for one. As the duty team students are required to take on many roles that are required to run a sporting competition or match. These include; umpire, scorer, timer, equipment managers, media representative and coach.

Students have enjoyed taking on these varied roles with many saying they enjoyed learning about and being a duty person just as much as a player. Students are excited to see which teams will finish on top in their class as that guarantees them a spot in the grand final at the end of the competition.
