Dear parents, grandparents and friends,

As our term draws to a close I have been thinking and reflecting on what we have achieved over the last 11 weeks, and where we head next.

Thanks to our wonderful community for a very successful start to the school year. We have managed to get through the term with very minimal disruption and have navigated through a number of big ticket events. Some of these include: a wonderful community evening, whole school sports day, 5/6 Camp, NAPLAN testing, Ecolinc excursions and much more. The support our school receives from our community is greatly appreciated and we know that 2023 is going to continue to be a very successful year.

Across the term, our staff have continued to refine our teaching and learning practice in the area of Literacy. Our Foundation to Grade 2 staff have further consolidated their phonics instruction and we have bolstered the decodable resources in classrooms, so that our students have access to the latest research based instruction in reading. Our 3-6 teams have worked hard to implement morphology instruction, which has been well received by our students.

In Inquiry, we have continue to refine our Inquiry cycles, so that the students have more agency in their learning. It was fantastic to see the authentic action taking place this week; especially as the Grade 5/6 students celebrated their newly acquired knowledge of the diverse cultures of the world. Our consultant, Andrea Hillbrick, will continue to work alongside our staff across the year, which we all feel most fortunate to be involved with.

Next term, whilst juggling the great work in Literacy and Inquiry, our focus will shift to refining our Numeracy and Wellbeing practices. We are looking forward to bringing back more consistency in the way we provide numeracy to our students, and also look for more opportunities to involve our wonderful community in school events.

Today, we raised awareness for World Autism Awareness Day. We were all treated to a story read to us by one of our amazing students, Lachie. So many of our friends, classmates, relatives, parents and associates have autism, and I firmly believe that we must continue to break down the many stigmas often unfairly associated with people on the spectrum. I asked our students to consider this statement: Autistic people are wonderful. They have a rich culture and bring great strengths into the world. They often think differently, offer unique perspectives and often communicate these in novel ways. We should continue to walk alongside people with autism, as we can all learn a great deal from each other.

Aara


Aara is a kind, caring and responsible student who demonstrates the school values each day.
