Our staff have diligently engaged with Professional Development outside of school hours. Our focus in Literacy has been continued refinement of our Phonics and Morphology instruction, as well as maintaining a focus on Fluency. In Numeracy, we have worked to develop and refine our individual goals and how we can best cater for these in the classroom. Our Wellbeing Team has continued the work on developing a suite of wellbeing supports for our children, which will continue well into 2024.

Looking forward to Term 3, I am delighted that we are planning some really exciting and significant events. We are also planning on having our annual Japanese Day, which I know was a great success last year. Stay tuned for more information about these events.






Under 12's Girls Football Competition REDAN FNC
