Dear parents, grandparents and friends,

Welcome to Term Three! I do hope that you all managed to get some time to spend as a family, 'in the moment', over the past couple of weeks. The Oliver household enjoyed a change of pace and some 'togetherness', whilst balancing work commitments.

This week, our staff met to further refine our teaching and assessment of Reading Fluency, as this will be a large part of our improvement strategy for this term. This year, our staff have been working behind the scenes to adopt a few minor changes to our Literacy Instruction, with the intent of further improving our student learning outcomes. Fluency, has been one such are we have looked at, specifically.

What is Reading Fluency? It's not just a matter of reading with speed. In fact, an accurate definition is "Reading at an appropriate pace, with accuracy and expression." What does this mean for our students? Quite simply, if a child isn't able to read with fluency, then this creates a significant barrier to comprehension. Below is a table of reading rates we are supporting our students to achieve.

Grade 1	60 Words Per Minute	
Grade 2	90-100 Words Per Minute	
Grades 3-6	100-120 Words Per Minute	

Want to help? Please continue doing what many of you diligently do almost every night, and listen to your child read. Sometimes, the books sent home may seem 'too easy'; however, this is actually a targeted strategy, as one of the ways we can build Reading Fluency is through repetition of familiar texts.

Next week, NAPLAN results will be released across the country. Attached to this newsletter is an information sheet regarding the changes to the format of how NAPLAN is reported. Our school leadership team is looking forward to analysing our school wide data, to plan for future school improvement.

I do worry, at times, that students place unnecessary pressure on themselves regarding their NAPLAN performance. I have written this before, and whilst NAPLAN gives our school the scope and capacity to further improve our practice, it does not define a child.

This week, we welcomed a new staff member, Chloe Hammill, to our Education Support Team. Chloe has worked with us in a casual capacity over the last 12 months, and has already endeared herself to students and staff.

I am feeling very positive about a great term ahead. As always, please reach out to our friendly staff if you have any thing you would like to clarify.

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Upcoming changes to NAPLAN reporting

Ahead of NAPLAN results for students being released from Monday 17 July 2023, I'm writing to inform you of some changes to this year's reporting. These are changes being introduced nationally by the Australian Curriculum Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA).

NAPLAN will continue to measure student achievement in numeracy, reading, writing, spelling, and grammar and punctuation but the results will now be presented in 4 proficiency levels:

These are:

- exceeding
- strong
- developing
- needs additional support.

Students' NAPLAN reports will continue to show how they are tracking against their peers and provide an indication of their skill levels against national averages and where we would expect them to be in order to get the most out of schooling. This provides valuable information to teachers about how we can continue to support your child.

Each set of NAPLAN results is an important milestone but it's also important that students know that one result does not define them – these results are about making sure every student gets the support they need so they can continue to get the best from their learning.

When we provide you with your results, you will also receive information about what the new proficiency levels mean.
