Extra-Curricular items and activities are provided on a user-pays basis.




The sessions will be facilitated by School Council Vice President Leith Thomas. We're looking forward to going on this journey together.

## National Consistent Collection of data on school students with Disability (NCCD)

All schools in Australia participate in the NCCD each year. The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with a disability that require adjustments to their daily program. These relate to legislative requirements under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 and the Disability Standards for Education 2005. Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes; year of schooling, category of disability (physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional), and level of adjustment provided (support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive). The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.
