5/6 Unit News

It has been a very busy start to Term 3 for the 5/6 unit. There have been many exciting

learning experiences taking place.



We have almost finished our first Literature Circle cycle for this term. It has been great to see so many engaging discussions taking place in our weekly meetings. Each week, students complete their allocated role and present their thoughts and opinions on the text. Everyone is thoroughly enjoying their novels. We can't wait for our literature circle celebration at the end of the term.

In Writing, we have been linking our biography writing with Inquiry. There have been many informative and well constructed biographies completed. Each student has completed a biography on an immigrant that crafted Australia over time. The eras that we have focused on include colonisation, the Eureka Stockade, the Gold Rush, Federation and Post War to





name a few.

In Maths, we have continued with our investigations. This term, our investigation revolves around a carnival. We have linked all sequences of learning to the carnival which include, types of numbers, the four operations, cartesian planes, elapsed time and data interpretation and representation. It has been great to see everyone embracing the carnival and completing tasks to an exceptional standard.

Our Inquiry is progressing nicely. We are currently at the 'Going Further' stage, where everyone is creating a Bottle Biography of their immigrant, and suitcase that represents key moments of their life. The dedication and creativity being displayed is nothing short of outstanding. In the last week of term, for our Authentic Action, we will be having an exhibition where everyone will present their completed bottle biography and suitcase. We can't wait to see how this all comes together!


