

- A procedure that you completed





Maths over the holidays

With holidays just around the corner, here are some fun mathematical activities to complete at home to link classroom learning to real life scenarios:

- Adding totals and calculating change at the shops
- Pay with cash and discuss Australian currency
- Tell the time on analogue and digital clocks
- Create a timetable or schedule for your daily activities You can also play some Mathematical games as a family.

What you need to play:

Ace - 10 playing cards



How to play:

- 1. The players use cards Ace - 10.
- 2. Deal out all cards, an equal number to each player.
- The first player turns over a card and places it face up in the centre of the play area. The next player 3. turns over another card and adds it to the card already there.
- 4. Play continues in this way until someone adds a card that makes 24 or more.
- 5. If the sum is exactly 24 that player wins.
- 6. If the sum is over 24 the value of the card is taken away from the previous total.
- Play continues until someone gets exactly 24.

Speeding

What you need to play:

You will need a card with each of the following values: 1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8,9,10 You can use these from a deck of cards or create cards using paper




How to play:

- 1. Place each card face down on the table in a row
- 2. As each card from 1-10 is on the table, the total of the cards is 55
- 3. Flip one card over at a time to calculate the running total
- When the last card is turned over the total MUST be 55. If you don't get to 55 you will need to go 4. back and check your calculations
- 5. To replay shuffle the order of cards and reset them face down

Challenge: Use a timer and time yourself. Try and get better each time

Variation: Work your way back from 55 to 0 using subtraction

Further Challenge: Multiply the numbers







The office has recently updated the school's permission and payment documentation.




In Term 4, please keep any eye out for neon pink documents in school and reader bags.

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
